However, that profession did not much interest him, for his acumen inclined to literary art. He left the practice in 1918 and worked as a Principal of J.L. New English School, Ahmedabad. In 1920, under the influence of Gandhian thoughts, he joined Gujarat Vidyapith with his friend Rasiklal Parikh and Mahadev Desai as lecturers. This phase of his life proved to be a major point in his life as a major 19th century Gujarati literary critic. In Vidyapith Pathak developed his two skills as a writer: 1) he studied Gujarati literature thoroughly and 2) he started writing for the magazines of Vidyapith. His works not only reflect the socio-cultural milieu of his time but also provide timeless insights into human emotions and societal dynamics.
